

March 31, 2019 "True To Your Word" Matthew 5:33-37

This week, Dr. Bill Johnston continued the "Sermon On The Mount" series. Reread those verses as you consider these questions.

- Are there areas of your life where your external appearance and your internal reality don't match? What are they? How are you using your external appearance to hide internal lies/deception?
- In <u>Matthew 5:33</u>, what was the commandment that was corrupted? What do <u>Exodus 20:7</u>, <u>Leviticus 19:12</u>, and <u>Numbers 30:2</u> tell us about how we should invoke the name of the Lord?
- Think about someone whose words you cannot trust. Why don't you trust what they say? What about your own words...can they be trusted? Why or why not?
- How do Jesus' words correct the "misinformation" we get from the world and our culture? What is the best way to know Jesus' words?





In your time with God this week,

- 1. Thank God for His Word that clearly shares His heart and character.
- 2. <u>Ask God</u> to show you the areas of your life where you are lying/deceiving yourself and others.
- 3. <u>Commit</u> to examine your own words this week and become more like Christ is your speech.

"Again you have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform to the Lord what you have sworn.' ³⁴ But I say to you, Do not take an oath at all, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God, ³⁵ or by the earth, for it is his footstool, or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. ³⁶ And do not take an oath by your head, for you cannot make one hair white or black. ³⁷ Let what you say be simply 'Yes' or 'No'; anything more than this comes from evil." - Matthew 5:33-37
