Open your Bible to Daniel 6. Tell the story using the pictured motions (keywords in bold) or show Bible Story 25 pictures.


What is something you do every day? Listen to our Bible story to find out what Daniel did every day.



Daniel was a man who loved God. One way he showed his love was by praying to God. Daniel prayed to God one, two, **three** times every day.




Daniel had an important job. He was the king's most important helper. The king liked Daniel very much. But there were some mean men who did not like Daniel. They were angry that the king liked Daniel better than them. These mean men thought of a plan to get Daniel in trouble with the king. 
Bible Verse:
