This week, Pastor David continued the "Galatians" sermon series by sharing about how our current actions determine our future.

- While this truth is often contested in our culture, Pastor David explained that our tomorrows are shaped in part by the decisions we make today. When are you tempted to think that you are not responsible for the choices you are making?
- You can plant the seeds of your life in one of two places: in the flesh (*sinful dispositions, nature, focus on self*) or in the Spirit (*goodness that flows from God's grace*). Where are you planting the seeds of your life?
- Identify a need for someone else that you could meet this week. What will be the "harvest" of your meeting that need?
