# IN ONE ACCORD

In music, an individual note brings its unique qualities, tone and timbre to the whole chord. When we join an orchestra, we are joining our unique talents, personalities and experiences. We individually come to be an important part of the whole helping to make one another stronger. Here are some guidelines to help us serve in one accord together.

#### **Our Mission & Ministry**

The musicians of the Dawson Sanctuary Orchestra desire through music, to become and help others become faithful servants of Jesus Christ. We live this out by leading in worship, participating in community events and offering musical training and concerts. Annually we present the following special services.

- Celebration Sunday: In partnership with the Dawson Music Academy, we invite students and instructors to join
  the orchestra. This gives many the opportunity to play with an ensemble but also to experience worship
  leadership.
- Candlelight at Dawson: Together with the Sanctuary Choir, we present these special services every third weekend in December.



oGood Friday Tenebrae: In the Spring we present a Tenebrae styled service that features instrumental music and scriptural meditations to help reflect and emphasize the crucifixion of Christ.

#### **We Are Worship Leaders**

It is important to remember that as you play in the orchestra, you are doing so as a worship leader here at Dawson. Worship is more than the music. It is the time when we as one body join together to remember, repent and refresh through fellowship, music, giving and listening. Whatever the case may be, our primary goal every week is to provide an underscore to

worship that helps connect the worshiper to their Savior and reminds them of the victories He has provided.

#### **Orchestra Membership**

Orchestra Membership is always open for anyone from high school to adults. There is no formal audition, but

instead, we ask that you attend at least two rehearsals and have a brief interview with the director to determine the best part for you to play. Once you have joined us, we ask that you stay connected through faithful at-home practice, group rehearsals, and playing for worship and concerts. We all have those times when we may need to be away. # WHAT, WHEN, WHERE



#### Rehearsals: Wednesday Night, 6:00pm



Rehearsals are typically in the Sanctuary and begin promptly at 6:00 pm and will finish by 7:30 pm. We will have a few "Bonus Rehearsals" from time to time as we prepare for special services and events (i.e. Candlelight, Holy Week). - We encourage the use of personal tablet music readers (i.e. iPad, Galaxy) by utilizing the free Music Stand app from Planning Center.
- We cover a lot of music within our rehearsal time so we ask that you do whatever you can to be here on time so we will all be best prepared.
- Please be in your seat with instrument tuned and music ready by the downbeat.
- Talking is natural but please respect others around you and the conductor on the podium.
- Be considerate and look for ways to always encourage musical and spiritual growth.

#### **Worship: Sunday Morning Services**

On Sunday Mornings that we play in worship, we play for all 3 services. The morning begins at 7:25 with a run through of the service in the Sanctuary.

Dress for worship services should reflect a respect for the position of a worship leader at Dawson. Further explanation can be found in our Apparel Guidance addendum in this book.

- When we leave a service, please go as quietly as possible, taking instrument and music.
- When you are finished securing your instrument, we ask that you proceed back to the sanctuary for the remainder of the service or join a LifeGroup for Bible study.
- Fragrances should be worn with discretion.

#### **Discipleship**

Discipleship is the intentional ongoing spiritual growth of each believer. We utilize rehearsal devotions and our fall retreat to aid in spiritual growth. Additionally, we encourage everyone to engage with a LifeGroup on Sunday mornings. **REMIND** 

The Dawson Sanctuary Orchestra utilizes Remind as a group text service to notify musicians of any changes, reminders, or updates. This is a key way that we are able to communicate with everyone quickly. You do not need the actual Remind app as these messages will come into your device Messages app. We do not give out your number and you will not receive junk messages. #### **MUSIC STAND APP & PLANNING CENTER ONLINE**

After joining the orchestra, you will be entered into our database called Planning Center Online. You will receive a confirmation email once registered and you can then set your own password. All rehearsal music, mp3's and service music will be made available to you through their Music Stand App so you can practice at home. This app is free at all app stores allowing you to access these files through your computer, phone or tablet. Furthermore, you are encouraged to use your own tablet for rehearsals and services.

# Apparel Guidance

FOR WORSHIP LEADERS



## **Servant Leaders In Worship**



#### **WE ARE ONE**

Worship leaders serve by preaching, singing or playing music, reading scripture or leading a prayer, giving the welcome or sharing announcements. We serve as a part of the congregation we lead, so we dress like them.



#### WELCOMING NEW LEADERS

Leading for the first time can be challenging enough without having to worry about what to wear. Here we share what we have learned from our experience in leading the Dawson Family of Faith in worship.



#### **HOSPITALITY MATTERS**

We choose clothing that reflects personal style and personality, while remembering that these choices are an act of hospitality and humility. Personal expression is secondary to effectiveness in our leadership.



#### **SERVING IS WORSHIP**

We are servants of the congregation. Our goal in worship is to encourage their voice.

## **Apparel Guidance**

#### MEN

#### **Shirts**

Yes: Long or short sleeved shirts with a folded collar; shirt tail tucked in.

Jacket, tie, and/or sweater optional.

No: T-shirts; shirts with logos or distracting patterns.

#### **Bottoms**

Yes: Solid slacks.

No: Jeans; brightly colored or distracting pants; distressing or holes.

#### Shoes

Yes: Dress shoes or boots in neutral colors.

No: Athletic shoes, sneakers of any kind, flip flops, sandals, or distinctly casual boots.

#### **Special Apparel**

For some special services, the worship or event leader will choose all black clothing. Please do not wear "All Black Clothing" performance apparel for worship or event leadership unless requested.

For some special services, the worship or event leader will choose an event-specific t-shirt. For these events, either all of us or none of us will wear them when we lead. No communication means we will not be wearing the event t-shirt. Please do not wear event t-shirts for worship or event leadership unless requested.







## **Apparel Guidance**

#### **WOMEN**

#### **Shirts**

Yes: Loose-fitting and longer, flowing shirts; shirts tucked in, or the bottom of shirt resting at low hip with arms fully raised; both shirts and tops need sleeves.

No: Sleeveless shirts or tops, t-shirts; white or sheer fabrics, logos or distracting patterns, cap sleeves, shoulder cutouts, busy prints, short or cropped shirts.

#### **Bottoms**

Yes: Tailored dress pants in a modest cut and dark colors.

No: Jeans; brightly colored or distracting pants; distressing or holes.

#### **Dresses & Skirts**

Yes: Hem at top of knee or lower; worn with or without solid, dark or neutral colored tights or leggings; sleeves required.

No: Hemlines above the knee, sleeveless dresses, sheer fabrics, distracting prints or colors; tights or leggings made of lace or other patterns.

#### **Shoes**

Yes: Dress shoes in styles including flats, wedges, boots, or heels.

No: Athletic shoes, sneakers of any kind, flip flops, sandals, or distinctly casual boots and wedges.

#### **Special Apparel**

For some special services, the worship or event leader will choose all black clothing. Please do not wear "All Black Clothing" performance apparel for worship or event leadership unless requested.

For some special services, the worship or event leader will choose an event-specific t-shirt. For these events, either all of us or none of us will wear them when we lead. No communication means we will not be wearing the event t-shirt. Please do not wear event t-shirts for worship or event leadership unless requested.













## **Apparel Guidance**

#### ALL BLACK CLOTHING

For some special services, the worship or event leader will choose all black clothing. Please do not wear "All Black Clothing" performance apparel for worship or event leadership unless requested.

#### Men

Yes: Solid, dark-black, long-sleeved shirt with folded collar and black buttons.

Shirt tail tucked in and cuffs buttoned.

Solid, dark-black pants that touch top of shoes.

Solid, dark-black dress shoes and socks.

Solid, dark-black belt.

Solid, dark-black jacket, optional.

Black clothing only. No visible colored garments under black clothing.

No: No tie; no white or colored buttons on shirt or pants; no cologne.

#### Women

Yes: Solid, dark-black top and pants.

Solid, dark-black dress with sleeves and hem to the knee.

Stud earrings, optional.

Black clothing only. No visible colored garments under black clothing.

No: No velvet, sheer fabric, or excessive texture; no necklaces or perfume.







## **Helpful Tips**

#### FOR ALL EVENTS

While looking in a mirror, exaggerate the movements you may be doing in worship to ensure you remain modestly covered.

Remember that the platform is elevated, so those on the floor are seeing you from below. Hemlines will appear shorter from the congregation.

Choose shoes and clothing that allow you to enter and exit the platform confidently and quietly.

Solid colors look best. Bold and busy patterns can be distracting on camera.
